

TERMS OF REFERENCE

The overarching aim of the Forest of Dean District Dementia Action Alliance (FODDAA) is to make sure that everyone in the district living with dementia is understood, respected, supported and enabled to continue to enjoy living their lives in their own community as well as possible for as long as possible. To support the wider community to understand dementia and inspire and enable people to do things which contribute to a dementia friendly community.

OBJECTIVES

- 1) To increase peoples' knowledge and understanding of dementia (all sectors public, private and VCS)
- 2) To increase the number of community buildings which are dementia friendly
- 3) To establish and maintain effective support through information sharing networks
- 4) To ensure that the voices of people with dementia, their carers, and families are heard and guide the work of the FODDAA
- 5) To seek membership from businesses, organisations, community groups and individuals across the Forest of Dean District.

The FODAA shall not be used as a platform for self-promotion, political promotion or marketing of a business or service.

MEMBERS OF THE FOREST OF DEAN DISTRICT DEMENTIA ACTION ALLIANCE (FODDAA):

- (a) Agree to take responsibility for and deliver their own actions to help improve lives of people living with dementia, their carers, and families
- (b) Attend meetings to discuss and update actions
- (c) Increase public awareness and understanding of dementia through their involvement in the FODDAA
- (d) Network, share information and ideas, and support joint learning amongst members of the Alliance
- (e) Work towards creating Dementia Inclusive Communities
- (f) Implement agreed FODDAA processes and procedures to ensure quality standards and consistency.
