

Former HSBC Bank - repurpose the bank building into a "High Street" hub for co-working, pop-up activity, café/bar and a flexible space for other uses. Installation of a Changing Places toilet facility with accessible WC & baby change. Rheola House – refurbish to create a Business Hub for local enterprise. Education and skills Increased opportunities for local talents, talent retention and growth of community groups within the District. Reduction in transport/travel needs and subsequent increased town centre footfall More community arts and cultural events with improved venues to improve community cohesion











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Access

- The Town Council's purchase of the HSBC bank was in part driven by the need to make the town centre more accessible to those with multiple and complex disabilities. Creation of a changing places toilet will enable many with disabilities to access the town centre and remain there for as long as they require.
- Public transport well served by 15 current bus services.

Enterprise and innovation

- Increased employment and self-employment opportunities, offering remote working solutions to those who would usually leave the Forest and Gloucestershire.
- Local private and social enterprises growing within Cinderford and taking on empty commercial premises.

Net Zero

- Cinderford Town Council has declared a Climate Emergency and has a Climate Action Committee that will monitor building refurbishment to ensure sustainable construction and renewable energy installation
- Remote working space at HSBC & Rheola house has potential to take 100 cars off the road each working day
- Reconfiguration of Belle Vue Centre car park to create a new public green space
- 4 EVCP & 4 E-bike charging units
