The Lottery funded programme aims to reduce the social and physical isolation of older, vulnerable and young people living in the Forest of Dean. At the end of the five year programme the aim is that rurally isolated older and vulnerable people report that they feel less isolated and more able to access social activities and health services through the provision of community transport. We want young people in our rural area to be more independent, accessing a variety of activities outside of school/training through community transport solutions. Local residents will be more knowledgeable and involved in Community Transport solutions, whether that be volunteering with one of the partners, attending one of the local forums or getting involved in local solutions.
